COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC:

- 1. Dowell Kincaid, citizen, spoke in regard to the Covid vaccine mandate at Hedrick Medical Center. The hospital is losing several employees due to this mandate and therefore asking if the City can do anything to hold the hospital accountable for at least 6 months to get the community through the flu season. City Administrator Darin Chappell explained the City owns the building, but they do not have the authority over the hospital or other businesses to intervene in how they operate their businesses.
- 2. Sara Gillilan, citizen, presented some informative discussion on monoclonal antibody infusion treatment and asked why it is not being offered here in Livingston County. Eric Reeter, Fire Chief, explained how the district areas are laid out.
- 3. Sierra Ishamel, business owner, commented that the City mandated masks and closed some businesses down last year so the City does have control to intervene with businesses. The mandate will hurt the health care in our community.
- 4. Toby Calivere, Airport Manager, announced that the Airport Fly In will be held Saturday, October 2nd.
- 5. Anthony Ishmael, citizen, asked the City to reconsider and intervene with the vaccine mandate. The City upheld the mask mandate and other regulations of businesses last year but now saying they can't intervene; City is being inconsistent.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AN IRREVOCABLE PLEDGE AGREEMENT WITH CHILLICOTHE DEVELOPMENT, INC., FOR A DONATION TO THE CITY TO ASSIST WITH THE PURCHASE OF REAL ESTATE BY THE CITY AND ALL ACTS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE TERMS OF SUCH CONTRACT.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHILLICOTHE, MISSOURI as follows:

Section 1: The City Council authorizes the City to enter into an Irrevocable Pledge Agreement with Chillicothe Development, Inc., for a pledge of donations to the City to be used for the purchase of 200 acres, substantially in the form on file with the City Clerk. The terms and provisions of the Agreement referenced are hereby approved and adopted by the City Council of the City of Chillicothe, Missouri, on behalf of said City. The Agreement pledges a donation to the City of \$1.5 million in principal payments plus interest.

<u>Section 2:</u> The City Council authorizes and directs the Mayor of the City of Chillicothe, Missouri to execute the Agreement and any documents the Mayor deems necessary or proper to carry out fully the terms of such Agreement. The Mayor, with the advice of the attorney acting for the City, may make minor corrections and changes to the Contract that does not affect the substance of the Agreement.

Section 3: The portions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining portions of this Ordinance are valid, unless the court finds the valid portions of this Ordinance are so essential and inseparably connected with and dependent upon the void portion that it cannot be presumed that the City Council would have enacted the valid portions without the invalid one, or unless the court finds that the valid portions standing alone are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.

<u>Section 4</u>: This ordinance repeals any prior ordinance or parts of any prior ordinance that might be in conflict herewith.

<u>Section 5:</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its passage and approval.

THE CITY OF CHILLICOTHE, MISSOURI AND CHILLICOTHE DEVELOPMENT. INC.

This Irrevocable Pledge Agreement is made and entered into this ____day of October 2021, between the City of Chillicothe, Missouri (herein the "City"), and Chillicothe Development, Inc. (herein "CDI").

RECITALS

- A. The City desires to purchase 200 acres of unimproved real estate (the "Property") for the purpose of developing the real estate into an industrial park.
- B. CDI is a not-for-profit corporation formed for the purpose of promoting industrial development to provide jobs and improve the economic opportunities for the citizens of Livingston County, Missouri.
- C. The City lacks the financial resources to purchase the Property and CDI has offered to assist the City in purchasing the Property by pledging to make gifts to the City for such purpose.

NOW THEREFORE, the Parties in consideration of the mutual agreements set forth agree as follows:

- 1. The City agrees to purchase the Property in its name for a purchase price of \$2,000,000 (the "Purchase Price") plus other ordinary and customary expenses of a real estate purchase.
- 2. The City agrees the Property will be developed, when needed in the City's sole discretion, as an industrial park which will be used to encourage the growth of jobs for the citizens of the Chillicothe area and provide for economic development in the Chillicothe area. The City will be responsible for all aspects of the development process but agrees to consult from time to time with CDI for its input into the development process.
- 3. The City will arrange for the financing for the purchase of the Property with the financing expected to be over at least a 20-year term at such terms and interest rate as the City deems appropriate.
- 4. The City will pay when due the payments required by the financing for the Property.

- 5. The City may manage the Property which may include the lease the Property for agricultural purposes or other compatible purposes until the Property is needed for economic development uses. The City shall receive all income generated from the agricultural leasing of the Property and will pay all expenses related to the Property.
- 6. The City, from time to time as it deems proper, may sell, lease, gift, or otherwise dispose of any part of the Property for economic development purposes. The City, as the sole owner of the Property, will receive the proceeds from any disposition of the Property but agrees, in the event of the sale or lease of any part of the Property, then the net proceeds will be first applied to payment of the principal part of the remaining indebtedness for the Purchase Price (allocated 25% to the indebtedness the City is to pay and 75% to the indebtedness CDI is to pay) and, if there are any remaining funds, used for economic development purposes of the City. In addition, the City may use any part of the Property for governmental purposes. If, in the future, the City determines that any part of the Property cannot be used for the intended economic development purposes, then that part of the Property may be (i) used for any related purposes that would assist in the economic development of the City or (ii) sold with the proceeds first to be used to pay any indebtedness on the Property as set forth above, or, if there is no indebtedness, then for economic development purposes of the City.
- 7. To assist the City with the purchase of the Property, CDI pledges to gift to the City the sum of \$100,000 per year until the total amount of the gift is equal to the amount needed to pay for \$1,500,000 of the purchase price **plus** the interest costs related to such part of the purchase price, provided that the gift amount will be reduced by any net proceeds applied to pay the purchase price pursuant to Paragraph 6 above. The first CDI gift of \$100,000 will be made at the closing of the real estate purchase, and the remaining gifts of \$100,000 per year will be made on each anniversary date of the closing and will continue until this pledge is fully paid. For example, CDI will gift \$100,000 at the closing of the purchase of the Property and (assuming no sales or leases) then will gift the City \$100,000 per year until \$1,400,000 of the purchase price plus interest costs as financed by the City is paid in full, which, if financed at 4% interest per annum, will take approximately 21 years to pay. CDI may accelerate its gifts at its sole discretion. For clarity, the City is to pay the remaining \$500,000 of the Purchase Price of the Property and the time and

manner in which the City makes its payment of that part of the Purchase Price does not affect the amount to be paid by CDI.

- 8. CDI understands and agrees its pledge is enforceable, binding, unconditional, and is not subject to cancellation, change, or modification, except with the written consent of the City. This pledge agreement is enforceable at law or in equity against CDI and its successors and assigns. The consideration for the pledge is as recited above and the City is relying on the CDI pledge in purchasing the Property and incurring the debt to finance such purchase.
- 9. This Agreement is binding upon the Parties and their successors and assigns.
- 10. The Agreement has been approved by the governing boards of each Party.
- 11. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties with regard to the matters referred to in this Agreement, and supersedes all prior oral and written agreement, if any, of the parties in respect to this Agreement. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by written agreement executed by both parties to this Agreement. The captions inserted in this Agreement are for convenience only and in no way define, limit, or otherwise describe the scope or intent of this Agreement, or any provision of this Agreement, or in any way affect the interpretation of this Agreement.
- 12. This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of Missouri without regard to any conflict of laws rule or principle that might refer the governance or construction of this Agreement to the laws of another jurisdiction.

COMMERCIAL REAL ESTATE SALES CONTRACT

PARTIES: This contract ("Contract") is made between:

SELLER: Jerry L. Nibarger and Rita Diane Nibarger, as Trustees of the Jerry L. Nibarger and Rita Diane Nibarger Revocable Living Trust dated July 7, 2005, whose address is 12315 Hwy V, Chillicothe, MO 64601, and

BUYER: The City of Chillicothe, Mo, 715 Washington St., Chillicothe, MO 64601, and its assigns,

and is effective as of the last signature on this Contract (the "Effective Date").

- 1. **PROPERTY:** Seller agrees to sell to Buyer and Buyer agrees to purchase from Seller the real estate shown on Exhibit A attached hereto, the legal description to be determined by a survey at the cost of the Buyer, which will be 200 acres of land. Such real estate shall be referred to in this Contract as the "Property".
- **2. EXCEPTIONS:** The Property shall be subject, however, to the Permitted Exceptions (as defined in the paragraph entitled "Title Insurance"), zoning ordinances and laws and shall be subject to a waterline easement described on Exhibit A.
- **3. PURCHASE PRICE:** The Purchase Price is \$10,000 per surveyed acre which Buyer agrees to pay as follows:
 - a. FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) at the signing of this Contract as Earnest Money, such to be deposited within five (5) days of the Effective Date, in the insured trust or escrow account of Staton Abstract and Title Co., 516 Washington Street, Chillicothe, MO 64601 ("Escrow Agent" and "Title Company") as part of the consideration of the sale,
 - b. The balance to be paid in guaranteed funds or cashier's check at Closing (as defined in this Contract), adjusted at Closing for pro-rations, closing costs and other agreed expenses. Seller will be responsible for one-half of the closing costs (including escrow agent's fees), standard owner's title insurance commitment and policy, and Seller's attorney's fees. Buyer will be responsible for one-half of the closing costs (including escrow agent's fees), special endorsements to the owner's title insurance policy, lender's title insurance policy, and Buyer's attorney's fees. Additional approved closing costs will be paid by Seller and Buyer equally, providing for appropriate prorations and adjustments.
 - c. In the event Buyer elects to terminate this Contract at, or prior to, the end of the Inspection Period, all Earnest Money shall be distributed to the Buyer.
- 4. CLOSING AND POSSESSION DATE: Subject to all the provisions of this Contract, the closing of this Contract (the "Closing") shall take place at the offices of Title Company, within 30 days following the expiration of the Inspection Period or prior thereto by mutual consent, and possession shall be delivered subject to Seller's existing Lease.

- **5. RENT AND TAXES:** The rent from the Property for 2021 shall be retained by the Seller. Seller shall pay all general real estate taxes levied and assessed against the Property for year 2021 and prior years. All such taxes becoming due and accruing during year 2022 shall be paid by the Buyer.
- 6. TITLE INSURANCE: Buyer shall pay for and obtain an owner's ALTA title insurance commitment and policy insuring marketable fee simple title in Buyer in the amount of the Purchase Price as of the time and date of recording of Seller's General Warranty Deed (the "Deed"), subject only to the Permitted Exceptions defined below. Buyer shall, as soon as possible and not later than ten (10) days after the end of the Inspection Period, order and thereafter cause to be furnished by the Title Company to Buyer a current commitment to issue the title policy ("Title Commitment"). Buyer shall have fifteen (15) days after receipt of the Title Commitment (the "Title Review Period") in which to notify Seller in writing of any objections Buyer has regarding any matters shown or referred to in the Title Commitment. Any matters which are set forth in the Title Commitment and to which Buyer does not object within the Review Period shall be deemed to be permitted exceptions to the status of Seller's title (the "Permitted Exceptions"). With regard to items to which Buyer does object within the Title Review Period, Seller shall have ten (10) days after receipt of Buyer's written notice of objections to cure such objections ("Title Cure Period"). If Seller does not cure the objections by the end of the Title Cure Period or if Seller and Buyer have not agreed to extend the Title Cure Period by amending this Contract, then this Contract shall automatically be terminated unless Buyer waives the objections no later than ten (10) days after the end of the Title Cure Period.

During the Due Diligence Period (as herein defined), Buyer at its cost shall order a survey of the Property. Unless otherwise objected to in writing by Buyer or Seller within five (5) days of delivery of the survey, the survey will be accepted as being correct for the Property and there will be no objections to such, except for objections that may be raised by the Title Company as a condition of title insurance.

- 7. INSPECTIONS: Seller shall grant Buyer reasonable access to the Property for one hundred twenty (120) days after the Effective Date (the "Inspection Period") for the purpose of inspecting the physical condition of the Property and determining if the Property is suitable for Buyer's intended uses. Buyer's inspection rights shall include performing soil tests, environmental tests or audits, and such other inspections or surveys as Buyer may reasonably request. Buyer agrees to repair any damage to the Property arising from these inspections and to indemnify, defend, and hold Seller harmless from and against all claims, costs, demands and expenses, including without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and other legal expenses, resulting from these inspections. Buyer's obligations imposed by this paragraph shall survive termination of this Contract. Buyer may terminate this Contract by written notice to the Seller prior to or at the end of the Inspection Period if the Buyer determines the Property is not suitable to Buyer for any reason. After the inspection period, the Buyer shall be deemed to be thoroughly acquainted and satisfied with the physical condition of the Property.
- **8. REPRESENTATIONS:** Buyer acknowledges neither Seller nor any party on Seller's behalf has made, nor do they hereby make, any representations as to the past, present or future condition, income, expenses, operation or any other matter or thing affecting or relating to the Property except as expressly set forth in this Contract.
- Seller represents, to Seller's knowledge, (i) the Property is in material compliance with all applicable federal, state and local environmental laws and regulations; (ii) Seller has not received, related to the

Property, any notice of any claims or allegation of liability under any federal, state or local environmental law; (iii) there are no contracts that affect the Property that will survive after the Closing except Seller's existing crop lease which will terminate as of December 31, 2021; and (iv) the Seller's disclosures on Exhibit B are correct. The representations set forth in this paragraph shall survive the Closing for a period of twenty-four (24) months.

- 9. REAL ESTATE BROKER: Seller and Buyer agree there is no real estate broker involved. Any party to this Contract through whom a claim to any broker's, finder's or other fee is made, contrary to the representations made above in this paragraph, shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other party to this Contract from any other loss, liability, damage, cost or expense, including without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees, court costs and other legal expenses paid or incurred by the other party, that is in any way related to such a claim. The provisions of this paragraph shall survive Closing or termination of this Contract.
- 10. DELIVERY OF DEED; PAYMENT; DISBURSEMENT OF PROCEEDS; POSSESSION: At or before Closing, Seller agrees to properly execute and deliver into escrow a General Warranty Deed (the "Deed") and all other documents and funds necessary to complete the Closing. The Deed shall convey to Buyer marketable fee simple title to the Property, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances, other than the Permitted Exceptions. At or before the Closing, Seller and Buyer each agree to deliver into escrow a cashier's check or guaranteed funds sufficient to satisfy their respective obligations under this Contract. Seller understands, unless otherwise agreed, disbursement of proceeds will not be made until after the Deed has been recorded and the Title Company can issue the title policy with only the Permitted Exceptions. Possession will be delivered on the Closing Date subject to the right of Seller's tenant to harvest the 2021 crops.
- 11. FOREIGN INVESTMENT: Seller represents that Seller is not a foreign person as described in the Foreign Investment in Real Property Tax Act and agrees to deliver a certificate at Closing to that effect which shall contain Seller's tax identification number. All parties represent and warrant that they are not and are not acting, directly or indirectly, for or on behalf of any person or entity named as a Specially Designated National and Blocked Person (as defined in Presidential Executive Order 13224) or with whom one is prohibits to do business under any anti-terror laws.
- **12. TERMINATION:** If this Contract is terminated by either party pursuant to a right expressly given in this Contract, the Earnest Money Deposit shall be disbursed as prescribed herein immediately, and neither party shall have any further rights or obligations under this Contract except as otherwise stated in this Contract.
- 13. In the absence of either written consent or written notice of a dispute, failure by either Buyer or Seller to respond in writing to a certified letter from the Escrow Agent within ten (10) days of receipt, or failure by either Buyer or Seller to make written demand upon the other party and upon the Escrow Agent for return or forfeiture of the Earnest Money Deposit, other escrowed funds or documents within ten (10) days after receiving written notice of cancellation of this Contract, shall constitute consent to the distribution of all funds and documents deposited with the Escrow Agent as suggested in any such certified letter or written demand. If a dispute arises over the disposition of funds or documents deposited with the Escrow Agent that results in litigation, any attorney's fees, court costs and other legal expenses incurred by the Escrow Agent in connection with such dispute shall be reimbursed from the Earnest Money Deposit or from other funds deposited with the Escrow Agent.
- **15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT AND MANNER OF MODIFICATION:** This Contract, and any attachments or addenda hereto, constitute the complete agreement of the parties concerning the Property, supersede all other agreements and may be modified only by initialing changes in this Contract or by written agreement.

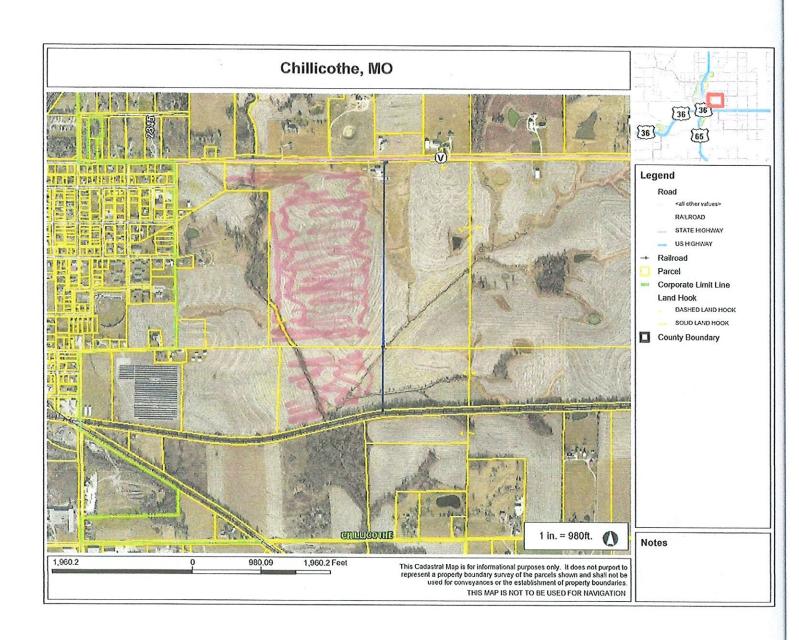

CONTRACT

This CONTRACT is entered into October	, 2021, by and between the
CHILLICOTHE FIRE PROTECTION DISTR	CICT NO. 1, referred as "DISTRICT", and the
CITY OF CHILLICOTHE, MISSOURI, a mui	nicipal corporation, referred to as "CITY".

RECITALS

- A. DISTRICT desires to contract with the CITY for firefighting services.
- B. DISTRICT and CITY are willing to enter into such a contract upon mutually agreeable terms and conditions.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the above recitals and of the terms and conditions set forth herein the parties mutually agree as follows:

SECTION 1. TERM, PURPOSE:

- 1.1 The term of this Contract shall be from January 1, 2022, until December 31, 2024 (the "Initial Term"), unless sooner terminated pursuant to this Contract. The Term of this Contract may be extended by mutual agreement for up to five (5) additional two (2) year terms (each a "Renewal Term"). If DISTRICT desires to extend the Contract it will notify the City in writing of such desire at least 90 days prior to the last day of the then current Term and the City will be deemed to have consented to the extension unless the City notifies DISTRICT that it will not extend the Contract within 30 days of the date of receipt of the written notice to extend from DISTRICT.
- 1.2 The CITY will provide to the DISTRICT, pursuant to the terms of this Contract, firefighting services of a type equivalent to the firefighting services provided by CITY to its residents, subject to limitations of firefighting in rural areas.
- 1.3 This Agreement shall in no way, either explicitly or impliedly, limit the discretion of the City's Fire Chief or, in his or her absence, the person responsible for management of the City Fire Department, in deciding the appropriate response of equipment and firefighters to fires within the DISTRICT'S boundaries or in withdrawal of equipment and firefighters from those boundaries. Such discretionary decisions made by the City Fire Chief or, in his or her absence the person responsible for management of the City Fire Department, shall be final and conclusive.

- 1.4 It is specifically understood between the parties that all persons who participate in rendering services for the CITY in accordance with this Agreement are employees of the CITY and as such are under the control and direction of the CITY, through its designated official(s), while rendering such services and the CITY shall be in complete control of all equipment and firefighters utilized in responding to, fighting, and returning from fires, unless other fire departments are rendering mutual aid.
- 1.5 Every officer, agent or employee of the CITY, and every officer, agent, or employee of an authorized provider of emergency services, including, but not limited to, every unit of government or subdivision thereof, while responding to emergency calls or reacting to emergency situations, regardless of whether any declaration of emergency has been declared or proclaimed by a unit of government or subdivision thereof, is hereby authorized to act or not to act in such a manner to effectively deal with the emergency. An action or inaction is "effective" if it in any way contributes or can reasonably be thought by the provider of such emergency service to contribute to preserving any lives or property. This Section shall prevail over every other standard of care provision in conflict with this Section. Neither the CITY nor the employee, agent, or officer thereof, or other unit of government or subdivision thereof or its employees, agents, or officers, shall be liable for failure to use ordinary care in such emergency. The intent of this Article is to assure effective action in emergency situations by those entrusted with the responsibility of saving lives and property by protecting such governmental units from liability, and their employees, agents, and officers from non-intentional tort liability to the fullest extent permitted by statutory and constitutional law and this Article shall be liberally construed.

SECTION 2. CONSIDERATION:

- 2.1 In consideration of the CITY rendering firefighting services, DISTRICT agrees to pay the CITY for services to be rendered under this Contract the consideration as set out in Paragraph 2.2 below.
- 2.2 The DISTRICT will pay the CITY for its services as follows:

An amount equal to Fifty percent (50%) of the annual ad valorem tax revenue collected by the DISTRICT for each calendar year this Agreement is in effect. The initial payment will be made on or before March 30 of each year and other payments will be made at the end of each calendar quarter thereafter as tax revenue is received.

The DISTRICT shall cause to be levied in each year a tax rate sufficient to satisfy the consideration for the services rendered pursuant to this Agreement, by timely directing the County in which the DISTRICT is located to levy a tax at the rate fixed at a charge equivalent to the amount of Thirty Cents (\$.30) per One Hundred

Dollars (\$100.00) assessed valuation of all tangible property within the DISTRICT. If the District elects to voluntarily reduce the tax rate, then the CITY can terminate this Agreement at any time upon 30 days' notice.

2.3 RESPONSE FEES

The CITY will waive any response fees to property within the DISTRICT. Notwithstanding, CITY shall be authorized to collect HAZMAT fees as authorized pursuant to Chapter 260 RSMO. Said HAZMAT fees shall not be paid by DISTRICT.

2.4 OTHER FEES

DISTRICT understands that CITY has instituted a system of charging for its emergency services responses to outside the CITY. The CITY will establish the fees for such services and will be responsible for the collection of such fees. These fees may include fees for responding to HAZMAT or other emergencies but, other than HAZMAT fees, will not charge any of these other fees for response to fires at property taxed within the DISTRICT. For clarity, the City may charge fees for responses to incidents on public roads or involving personal property not taxed within the DISTRICT.

SECTION 3. DISTRICT'S DUTIES:

DISTRICT agrees:

- 3.1 To obtain at its expense and maintain in force during the Initial Term or a Renewal Term of this Contract a policy of public liability insurance equal to the sovereign immunity limits as determined yearly by the Missouri Department of Insurance. The CITY shall be named as an additional insured on such policy. DISTRICT will provide proof of insurance before commencement of each term ofthis Contract and thereafter on request by the CITY. This insurance shall be primary and non-contributory to any insurance of the City for any occurrences within the District or while the City is responding to an occurrence within the District.
- 3.2 DISTRICT shall be responsible for payment of any maintenance or repair of all motor vehicles or other property leased to the CITY by the DISTRICT except the CITY will pay the cost of repairs up to \$3000 in any calendar year. If the repairs will cost more than a total of \$3000 in a calendar year, CITY shall notify DISTRICT prior to authorizing said repairs. NOTWITHSTANDING, if any repair is cosmetic in nature, CITY shall obtain approval from DISTRICT if it will cost more than \$1000.

3.3 To provide the CITY a map of the geographic boundaries of the DISTRICT.

SECTION 4. CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES:

CITY will have the following responsibilities:

- 4.1. In regard to any motor vehicle leased to the CITY by DISTRICT, the CITY agrees:

 (i) to obtain at its expense insurance on the leased motor vehicles similar to the insurance that the CITY maintains on its own fire protection vehicles, and
 (ii) to pay other customary operating expenses on the vehicles, except for fuel costs in excess of \$1500 per year.
- 4.2 To have DISTRICT'S lender on any DISTRICT vehicle, if any, named as a loss payee under its property insurance policy covering any leased DISTRICT vehicle. In the event of an insured loss, to the extent the insurance proceeds are not required to be paid to DISTRICT'S lender, the insurance proceeds will be paid to DISTRICT which will use the proceeds to repair or replace the damaged vehicle.

SECTION 5. EQUIPMENT:

- As additional consideration for such services by the CITY, DISTRICT leases to the CITY for the term of this Contract for \$1.00 per year, the following vehicles identified in Exhibit A attached.
- 5.2 DISTRICT authorizes the CITY to use such vehicles attached in Exhibit A for any emergency services provided by the CITY for its citizens, the DISTRICT, or others, so long as at the time of commencement of such use the equipment is not needed to provide emergency services for DISTRICT. It is understood by the Parties that all "Loose Equipment" is the property of CITY and shall be the CITY'S responsibility.
- 5.3 CITY may place its fire department logo on the leased property.

SECTION 6. CONTROL AND DISCRETION OF CITY

- 6.1 The CITY shall have the sole and absolute discretion in determining the methods, manpower, and firefighting equipment to be used in responding to emergencies of the DISTRICT.
- 6.2 DISTRICT specifically understands and agrees that the CITY'S contractual agreement to provide emergency services under this Contract is owed solely to DISTRICT.
- 6.3 If the CITY is not fully indemnified by DISTRICT'S liability insurance for any action, claim, cause of action, liability, costs, or expense which the CITY may

incur as a result of providing services to DISTRICT under this Contract, to the extent permitted by law but not exceeding the then sovereign immunity limits of the State of Missouri, the DISTRICT agrees to reimburse the CITY for any losses or injuries resulting from providing services to the DISTRICT as a result of the negligence of the DISTRICT or its officers or employees. Nothing in this Agreement expands or broadens the liability of either party beyond any applicable sovereign immunity limits or other applicable Missouri statutes, nor abolishes or waives any defense at law which might otherwise be available to the either party or its officers and employees. For clarity, all employees of the CITY providing firefighting services are only employees of the CITY and covered only by its workers compensation insurance.

SECTION 7. TERMINATION:

- 7.1 This Contract may be terminated prior to the expiration of the term upon mutual agreement only unless the DISTRICT fails to pay the CITY for the services in which case the CITY may termination this Contract if the DISTRICT fails to cure any payment default within 10 days of written notice received from the CITY.
- 7.2 In the event of termination or expiration of this Contract, the CITY agrees to transfer possession of the leased DISTRICT property to DISTRICT free and clearof any liens or encumbrances caused by or placed thereon by the CITY in connection with repairs, storage, or maintenance. The vehicles shall be transferred in an "as is" condition.

SECTION 8. GENERAL PROVISIONS:

The following provisions will apply to both parties:

- 8.1 This Contract is binding upon the successors and assigns of each party.
- 8.2 In the event that either of the parties hereto must file suit to enforce any of the provisions of this Contract including, but not limited to, the obligation to pay fees, then the parties agree that the prevailing party in any such suit shall be entitled to recover its reasonable attorney's fees and costs in any such suit.
- 8.3 The laws of the State of Missouri shall govern this Contract.
- 8.4 This Contract is binding on the parties and their respective successors and assigns, provided that neither party may assign its interest in this Contract without the prior written consent of the other party.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, this Contract is executed the several counterparts, each of which shall be considered an original.

Chillicothe Police Department Patrol Fleet Plan

I currently have a fleet of five 2020 patrol vehicles, each with approximately 25,000 miles on them. I then have two 2017 patrol vehicles, each with approximately 81,000 miles on them. Also in the fleet is a 2016 K9 vehicle, which was obtained as a used vehicle, with 104,000 miles; a 2015 patrol vehicle with 94,000 miles on it and the transmission going out; and a 2013 patrol vehicle with 84,000 miles on it. See attached list.

We have had several plans on how to maintain patrol vehicles to provide a service to the community, but at this time, I feel in the best interest of the City of Chillicothe, the citizens, and the police officers, to get our fleet to an adequate standard for service. The plan I propose would be to purchase three patrol vehicles in the current budget, specifically would be two 2020 Ford Explorers and a 2020 F-150 patrol truck. By doing so, I would replace the 2013 patrol vehicle with 84,000 miles, the 2015 patrol vehicle with 94,000 miles, and one 2017 patrol vehicle with 84,000 miles with new vehicles. This would replace two patrol units and a supervisor unit. The other 2017 patrol vehicle with 84,000 miles would be used as an administrative vehicle, replacing the vehicle now utilized as such. This would place CPD on track to only have to purchase two vehicle per year to maintain a usable fleet for the CPD.

Unit 42 has the transmission going out of it, and Unit 43 is in the beginning stages of transmission problems. Unit 48 is the oldest vehicle and has the highest mileage. While the 2017 patrol vehicle is high mileage, it would serve adequately in the roll of an administrative vehicle.

In talking with companies that supply patrol vehicles, they will not provide a date in which you will be able to physically receive a patrol unit, as there is a shortage of vehicle and supplies. I have located two 2021 patrol vehicle and a new 2020 F150, all in which are in stock and ready to be built with equipment. This company prepared for this type of shortage and has the vehicles in stock while supplies last. The purchase of these three vehicles is \$95,038 for the two 2021 Ford Explorers and the 2020 Ford F150 \$48,884 totaling \$143,992. The total price is represents a completely built vehicle including emergency equipment. However, there are items specific to CPD that would have to be moved over to the vehicles such as radios, radars, camera system, etc. The estimated cost of this equipment transfer is \$5,854.20. The total cost of the project is estimated to be \$150,000.

I have to provide Dana Safety Supply with an update as soon as possible for them to hold these vehicles for CPD. Normally they are sold on a first come, first serve basis.

CPD Officers on average place 25,000 miles a year on each patrol unit. The goal is to get these vehicle out of service by 80,000 miles for benefits of reliable use, trade-in value, and liability issues.

Lastly, if this is approved and completed, we would plan to purchase 2 vehicles per year, unless anything unforeseen occurs. A two vehicle per year acquisition plan creates reliable fleet management and maintenance, and makes budgeting for the department's fleet consistent year after year.

The estimated trade in value is \$25,000 for the 2017, 2015, and 2013.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-

An Ordinance Authorizing A Contract with 42 C.A.R.E.S, Inc. For Medical Services for Medical Services For City Employees and Authorizing All Acts Necessary To Carry Out Such Contract

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHILLICOTHE, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The City Council approves and authorizes a Contract (the "contract") with 42 C.A.R.E.S, Inc. for medical services for certain City employees, in the form on file with the City Clerk. The cost of such contract is \$5.50 per member for year.
- Section 2. The City Council authorizes and directs the Mayor of the City of Chillicothe, Missouri to execute the Contract and to do any act needed to carry out the terms of such contract.
- Section 3. The portions of this Ordinance shall be severable. In the event that any portion of this Ordinance is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the remaining portions of this Ordinance are valid, unless the court finds the valid portions of this Ordinance are so essential and inseparably connected with and dependent upon the void portion that it cannot be presumed that the City Council would have enacted the valid portions without the invalid one, or unless the court finds that the valid portions standing alone are incomplete and are incapable of being executed in accordance with the legislative intent.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance repeals any prior ordinance or parts of any prior ordinance that might be in conflict herewith.

CONTRACT

This is a contract between 42 C.A.R.E.S., INC (42 CARES) and the City of Chillicothe, Missouri.

I. Parties

42 C.A.R.E.S., INC (42 CARES) is a Missouri non-profit corporation which provides certain medical services to its members. The City of Chillicothe is a municipality which has eligible employees who will benefit from the services provided by 42 CARES.

II. Compensation.

- A. 42 CARES shall provide services at the rate of \$5.50 per 66 members, per month, payable as an annual sum of *four thousand three hundred fifty-six dollars* (\$4,356.00) in one installment, by the 1st of November 2021. If the installment is not paid by the 15th of November 2021, 42 CARES may withhold provision of services or may cancel this contact at its option.
- B. If 42 CARES defaults in the performance of this Contract, in addition to any other remedies, the City of Chillicothe may withhold payment(s) until the default is cured.

III. Scope of Services.

42 CARES shall perform the following services for the qualified employees to the degree not inconsistent with any applicable Memorandum of Understanding or Collective Bargaining Agreement, if any, to which such qualified employee is subject (who are the City's fire fighters, police, and dispatchers) and their immediate families for which services are contracted:

A. Behavioral Health/Employee Assistance Program (EAP)

- 1. Offer all qualified employees, and their spouses and dependents, professional counseling, assessment, and referral through licensed clinicians. They will be eligible to receive 7 sessions per year.
- 2. Provide 24/7 emergency coverage through an assigned account representative, the EAP Director and other clinicians. 42 CARES shall provide a cellular number for a representative who shall be available in the event of an emergency. Such representative shall be trained on all aspects of the EAP program components and protocol.
- 3. Deliver support and consultation as needed in the development of an Occupational Stress Program.

- 4. Assist with facilitation of referral and level of care approval process for qualified employees and their dependents covered by insurance. EAP representatives shall participate in meetings with insurance company representatives as needed to facilitate improved coordination and ease of referral.
- 5. Assist with delivery of training modules for all qualified personnel as needed to increase participation and ensure adherence to the EAP policy.
- 6. Develop training module to all new qualified employees and newly promoted managers to stress, dispute management and other behavioral health issues.
- 7. Provide professional counseling, assessment and referral for those qualified employees who have been mandatorily referred pursuant to a relevant established drug and alcohol misuse testing policy. Such counseling, assessment and referral shall be in a manner consistent with any such policy.

B. Data Collection and Reporting

- 42 CARES shall submit data quarterly to the City Auditor for internal review. This data shall be presented in a format needed for submission per request. All data shall be provided in format that complies with the input parameters for national survey instruments.
- 2. Data shall include activity reports and aggregate data from all clinical and health screenings. Individually protected health information will not be in such reports.

IV. Effective Date and Term of Agreement.

This Contract will become effective upon approval by the City Council and execution by the Mayor. This Contract shall terminate one year from its effective date. The City of Chillicothe is authorized to enter into one amendment to extend the term of this Contract of the same price, terms, and conditions.

V. Indemnification

- A. For purposes of this Section only, the following terms shall have the meanings listed:
 - 1. Claims means all claims, damages, liability, losses, costs and expenses, court costs, and reasonable attorneys' fees, including attorneys' fees incurred by the City of Chillicothe in the enforcement of this indemnity obligation.
 - 2. 42 CARES' Agents means it's officers, employees, consultants, subcontractors, successors, assignees, invitees, and other agents.
 - 3. The City of Chillicothe means its agents, officials, officers, and employees.

- B. 42 CARES' obligations under this Paragraph with respect to indemnification for acts or omissions, including negligence, to the City of Chillicothe shall be limited to the coverage and limits of insurance that 42 CARES is obligated to obtain. 42 CARES shall provide the City with proof of such insurance prior to the effective date of this Contract and thereafter during the term of the Contract on request by the City.
- C. 42 CARES shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Chillicothe from and against all claims arising out of or resulting from all acts or omissions in connection with the services provided by this Contract, caused in whole or in part by 42 CARES' and its Agents or employees, regardless of whether or not caused in part by any act or omission, including negligence, of the City of Chillicothe. 42 CARES is not obligated under this Section to indemnify of City of Chillicothe for the sole negligence of the City of Chillicothe.
- D. Nothing in this Section shall apply to indemnification for professional negligence.
- E. In no event shall the language in this Section constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation of the City of Chillicothe's rights or defenses with regard to sovereign immunity, governmental immunity, or other official immunities and protections as provided by the federal and state constitutions or by law.

VI. Indemnification for Professional Negligence.

42 CARES shall indemnify, and hold harmless the City of Chillicothe and any of its agencies, officials, officers, or employees from and against all claims, damages, liability, losses, costs, and expenses, including reasonable attorneys' fees, arising out of any negligent acts or omissions in connection with this Contract, caused by 42 CARES, its employees, agents, subcontractors, or caused by others for whom 42 CARES is liable, in the performance of professional services under this Contract. 42 CARES is not obligated under this Section to indemnify the City of Chillicothe for the negligent acts of City of Chillicothe or any of its agencies, officials, officers, or employees.

VII. Independent Contractor.

42 CARES is an independent contractor as regards the Scope of Work in this Contract, and is not the City of Chillicothe's agent or employee. 42 CARES has no authority to take any action or execute any documents on behalf of the City of Chillicothe in connection with such Scope of Work.

VIII. Insurance.

A. 42 CARES shall procure and maintain, in effect throughout the duration of this Contract, insurance coverage not less than the types and amounts specified in

this Section. Policies containing a Self-Insured Retention are unacceptable to the City of Chillicothe unless the City of Chillicothe approves in writing the Self-Insured Retention.

- 1. Commercial General Liability Insurance: with limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate, written on an "occurrence" basis. The policy shall be written or endorsed to include the following provisions:
 - a. Severability of Interests Coverage applying to Additional Insureds.
 - b. Per Project Aggregate Liability Limit or, where not available, the aggregate limit shall be \$2,000,000.
 - c. No Contractual Liability Limitation Endorsement.
- 2. If applicable, Workers' Compensation Insurance, as required by statute, including Employers Liability with limits of \$100,000 per accident with limits of \$500,000 disease-policy limit and \$100,000 disease-each employee.
- 3. Professional Liability Insurance with limits per claim and annual aggregate of \$1,000,000.
- 4. All insurance coverage must be written by companies that have an A.M. Best's rating of "A-V" or better and are licensed or approved by the State of Missouri to do business in Missouri.
- 5. 42 CARES' failure to maintain the required insurance coverage will not relieve 42 CARES of its contractual obligation to indemnify the City of Chillicothe pursuant to the above Sections. If the coverage afforded is cancelled or changed or its renewal is refused, 42 CARES shall give at least thirty (30) days prior written notice to the City of Chillicothe. In the event of 42 CARES' failure to maintain the required insurance in effect, the City of Chillicothe may upon ten (10) days' notice and with an opportunity to cure within that period, pursue its remedies for breach of this Contract as provided for herein.
- 6. In no event shall the language in this Section constitute or be construed as a waiver or limitation of the city of Chillicothe's rights or defenses with regard to sovereign immunity, governmental immunity, or other official immunities and protections as provided by the federal and state constitutions or by law.

IX. Governing Law.

The provisions of this Contract shall be construed and governed in accordance with the laws of the State of Missouri without giving effect to Missouri's choice of law provisions. The parties hereto submit to the jurisdiction of the state and federal courts located in Jackson County, Missouri, waive any and all objections to jurisdiction and venue; and will not raise forum non conveniens as an objection to the location of any litigation.

X. Compliance with Laws.

42 CARES shall comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances and regulations applicable to the Scope of Services of this Contract.

XI. Termination.

The City of Chillicothe may, at any time upon ten (10) days' notice to 42 CARES specifying the effective date of termination, terminate this Contract, in whole or in part. If this Contract is terminated by the City of Chillicothe, it shall be liable only for payment for services rendered before the effective date of termination.

XII. Default and Remedies.

If 42 CARES shall be in default or breach of any provision of this Contract, the City of Chillicothe may terminate this contract, suspend the City of Chillicothe's performance, withhold payment or invoke any other legal or equitable remedy after giving 42 CARES notice and opportunity to correct such default or breach.

XIII. Waiver.

- A. Waiver by the City of Chillicothe of any term, covenant, or condition hereof shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or of any other term, covenant, or condition. No term, covenant, or condition of this Contract can be waived except by written consent of the City of Chillicothe and forbearance or indulgence by the City of Chillicothe in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver of same to be performed by 42 CARES to which the same may apply and, until complete performance by 42 CARES of the term, covenant or condition, the City of Chillicothe shall be entitled to invoke any remedy available to it under this Contract or by law despite any such forbearance or indulgence.
- B. Waiver by 42 CARES of any term, covenant, or condition hereof shall not operate as a waiver of any subsequent breach of the same or of any other term, covenant, or condition. No term, covenant, or condition of this Contract can be waived except by written consent of the 42 CARES and forbearance or indulgence by 42 CARES in any regard whatsoever shall not constitute a waiver of same to be performed by the City of Chillicothe to which the same may apply and, until complete performance by the City of Chillicothe of the term, covenant, or condition, 42 CARES shall be entitled to invoke any remedy available to it under this Contract or by law despite any such forbearance or

indulgence.

XIV. Modification.

Unless stated otherwise in this Contract, no provision may be waived, modified or amended except in writing signed by the parties.

XV. Severability of Provisions.

Except as specifically provided in this Contract, all of the provisions shall be severable. In the event that any provision of this Contract is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or unlawful, the remaining provisions of this Contract shall be valid unless the court finds that the valid provisions of this Agreement are so essentially and inseparably connected with and so dependent upon the invalid provision(s) that it cannot be presumed that the parties to this Contract could have included the valid provisions without the invalid provision(s); or unless the court finds that the valid provisions, standing alone, are incapable of being performed in accordance with the intentions of the parties.

XVI. Records.

- A. For purposes of this Section "Record" shall mean any document, book, paper, photograph, map, sound recordings, or other material, regardless of physical form or characteristics, made or received in connection with this Contract and all amendments and renewals, but excludes, consistent with the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, 45 CFR Part 160 and Subparts A and E of Part 164, medical records of the individual member who receives services from 42 CARES.
- B. 42 CARES shall maintain and retain all Records for a term of five (5) years that shall begin after the expiration or termination of this Contract and all extensions. Subject to applicable state and federal law, the City of Chillicothe shall have a right to examine or audit all Records and 42 CARES shall provide access to the City of Chillicothe of all Records upon ten (10) days written notice from the City of Chillicothe.
- C. The books, documents, and records of 42 CARES in connection with this Contract shall be made available to the City of Chillicothe within ten (10) days after the written request is made.

XVII. Assignability.

42 CARES shall not assign or transfer any part, or all, of its obligation or interest in this Contract without prior written approval of the City of Chillicothe. If 42 CARES shall assign or transfer any of its obligations or interests under this Contract without the city of Chillicothe's prior written approval, it shall constitute a material breach of such Contract. This provision shall not prohibit 42 CARES from subcontracting as otherwise provided for herein.

XVIII. Subcontracting.

42 CARES may subcontract any part, or all, of its obligations or interests in this Contract. A regular meeting of the Board of Public Works was held on October 5, 2021, at 7:00 a.m.

Also present were Katie Bolling, Finance Director; Casey Johnson, Electric Superintendent; Richard Allwood, Asst. Water Resources Superintendent; Troy Figg, Refuse Director; and Jennifer Flint, Executive Assistant.

The guests present were Mayor Theresa Kelly, and Councilmen Wayne Cunningham and Reed Dupy.

AWARD PRESENTATION

Jeff Arp, Loss Control Specialist for MIRMA, was present at the meeting to present CMU with a Risk Management Grant in the amount of \$4,777.65. Jeff reported that Katie Bolling submitted the grant applications for the purchases of a sewer camera in the amount of \$4,017.00 and an AED unit for the Office in the amount of \$760.65. Jeff stated this is a reimbursement grant in which the items are purchased and then MIRMA will reimburse the amount award.

BOARD MINUTES

Minutes of the Regular Board Meeting for September 21, 2021, were read and subsequently approved on a motion made by Ed Martens with Howard Weldon seconding the motion. The Board approved with Mary Turner, Ed Martens, Rolfe McCoy, and Howard Weldon all voting yes.

SALARIES AND INVOICES

Payments of salaries and invoices were presented to the Board for approval. Ed Martens made a motion to approve the payments of salaries and invoices with Howard Weldon seconding the motion. The Board approved with Mary Turner, Ed Martens, Rolfe McCoy, and Howard Weldon all voting yes.

ELECTRIC DEPARTMENT

- A. Casey Johnson reported there has been another customer take advantage of the back lot line rebate. There was an inquiry if this rebate is available for the Ballentine area only. Matt stated that anyone interested in undergrounding their services where access to our services is difficult is eligible for the rebate. Casey also noted the line crew has been working South of Dorney Drive behind the duplexes reconductoring, cutting down trees, and cleaning up.
- B. Casey stated the 27-minute outage on September 26th was due to a limb falling out of a tree located on the Country Club property onto the 69KV line. Casey reported that a semi had also pulled a couple of poles down along Gilbert Street on September 29th.
- C. Casey reported he has been working with Allgier & Martin engineers on the Second Street Project.
- D. Casey also reported that the IT Techs have noticed that Substation D's transformer is leaking oil into the tap changer. Casey stated that 3MD is expected to submit a quote for repairs.
- E. Casey informed the Board that World Wide Turbine is scheduled to begin bore scoping on the Power Plant units.

F. Casey stated that 88 electric and 2347 water meters have been installed. Casey reported that Sensus has scheduled the SA training for October 8th.

WATER RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

- A. Richard Allwood stated the staff at the Wastewater Treatment Plant and Water Treatment Plant have been performing normal maintenance and mowing at the facilities.
- B. Richard reported the Underground Facility Crew has been busy doing locates and fixing water breaks. Richard stated that 807 water meters have just been received and will be installed.
- C. Richard also reported that a drain line has been installed in the holding pond which will allow easier access to the pump when it is time to remove it for maintenance.
- D. Richard noted the Underground Facility Crew has the lime equipment ready for land application. Richard stated that the land application process will start when the soil sample from Randy Price's farm ground is received.

REFUSE DEPARTMENT

A. Troy Figg stated that 91 customers took advantage of the Hazardous Waste Collection last Saturday, October 2nd. Troy stated that this number is down from previous years. Troy informed the Board that CMU will absorb the full cost from Safety Kleen as North Central Missouri Solid Waste District will not be assisting with the payment for collection. Troy indicated that North Central Missouri Solid Waste District is looking to start satellites collections sites and has asked CMU to apply to serve as a pilot collection site. Troy reported the crew has been busy breaking down material collected which takes the crew's extra time.

FINANCE DIRECTOR

- A. Katie Bolling distributed a copy of the holiday calendar inserts that will be placed in customer statements notifying them of the upcoming days CMU will be closed and the alternate trash collection dates in November this year.
- B. Katie also updated that Board on the online bill pay application for customers.
- C. Katie also distributed a flyer indicating a NASB CD special for 7-months at 0.60% which requires opening a checking account along with the CD placement. Katie stated that the banks offering this program is out of the market area. It was suggested that area banks will likely follow suit and that we should wait to see if this program will become available in our market area.
- D. Katie presented documents as a state of address on the overall financial overview showing the 2022 Revenue vs Expenses, Cash Level Policies, and Revenue by Account Type.
